Program Highlights

Community Living

The Community Living services encompasses the Supported Living and Independent Living departments. These departments provide flexible and tailored support to individuals living on their own or those developing the necessary skills to live independently. We were able to serve 94 people in this program.

In the picture above, LaDonna is out shopping for groceries with her ILS Instructor Jennifer. Together they work on things like budgeting, setting up shopping lists, finding healthy alternatives, and handling monthly household bills.

Community Employment

The community Employment Department encompasses three programs: Supported Employment, Tailored Day Services, and Job Development. This department aims to support people with intellectual and developmental disabilities as they find, obtain, and retain competitive employment within the community. This year, we supported people with 12 new jobs and continued to provide support for 76 individuals.

Community Training

The Community Training Program (CTP) is a community-based program that helps people find opportunities to explore their strengths while learning vital daily life skills. It provides vocational and social skills training to recognize, develop, and build the necessary tools for participants to participate in their community at the level at which they choose. Throughout the North Valley, Placerville, and Sacramento areas, we have served 189 people this last fiscal year.

In the photo above, Andi is sorting and organizing newspapers to be used to line the kennels for small animals at the Sacramento SPCA. This is an essential job for the bunnies, guinea pigs and hamsters at the shelter so that they can be comfortable while they wait to be adopted.

Work & Life Skills

The Work and Life Skills program is a community-based program combining vocational training and community access services. Individuals in the program gain paid work experience in small groups with one staff at community-based job sites. The desired outcome of this program is increased community integration and participation in supported work. This year, we supported 33 people in WLS.


CDSA Legislative Affairs Conference





